**PRIVACY POLICY** 

#### Introduction

The Netherlands France Chamber of Commerce hereafter NFCC takes your privacy very seriously and shall handle your personal data with the utmost security and care. In this Privacy Statement you will learn how we handle your data as well as learn about your rights concerning our processing of your data. We advise that you read this Privacy Statement thoroughly. #### Who is NFCC?

NFCC is an association under the Law of 1901 Registered under number W751258734 with legal seat on 41 rue de la Chaussée d'Antin 75009 Paris.

NFCC is as the controller ultimately responsible with regard to the processing of your personal data.

## How does NFCC use your personal data?

Underneath you will find an overview of the purposes for the processing of your personal data. You will also find a specification of which data NFCC uses for that specific purpose, the legal justification, and the amount of time NFCC keeps this data. ### How did we obtain your personal data?

NFCC has obtained your data because you have provided this data to us.

### What are your rights?

Under the European General Data Protection Regulation you have a number of rights with regard to your data and the processing thereof:

### Access

You may access your personal information and make any necessary changes in your account. If you would like to see which personal data NFCC has obtained about you, you may exercise your right of access by submitting a request to NFCC.

### Making changes

If you wish to make changes to the personal information that you have seen as a result of a request for access and you are unable to make the changes yourself in your account, you may request that NFCC makes these changes for you. You may request that NFCC modifies, corrects, supplements, erases or shields your information.

### Restriction of processing of personal data

You also have the right, under certain conditions, to ask NFCC to restrict the processing of your personal data.

### **Right to object**

If processing of your data takes place on the grounds of 'legitimate interest' by NFCC or a third party, you have the right to object to that processing.

#### Portability of data

You have the right to obtain your personal data from NFCC. NFCC will provide this in a structured and commonly used format, which can easily be opened using commonly used digital systems.

#### Withdrawing consent

When the legal basis for a particular processing is your explicit consent, you have the right to withdraw that consent. This does not affect past processing but does mean that we will no longer be allowed to process this data in the future. It may also result in NFCC no longer being able to provide you with certain services.

## **Response from NFCC**

A request can be sent to info@nfcc.fr. NFCC will comply with your request as soon as possible and in any case no later than one (1) month after NFCC has received such a request. If NFCC rejects your request, we will indicate in our reply why the request was rejected.

#### **Recipients of your personal data**

It is possible that NFCC is required to submit your data to a third party, for example to fulfil a legal obligation.

## What are cookies and how does NFCC use them?

Cookies are small pieces of (text) information that are sent to your browser when you visit the website of NFCC and then stored on the hard disk or in the memory of your device. The cookies placed via NFCC's website cannot damage your device or the files stored on it. With 'cookies', we also mean comparable techniques collecting information, such as device fingerprinting.

## Can changes be made to this Privacy Statement?

This Privacy Statement is subject to changes. We, therefore, advise you to regularly read the Privacy Statement for any such changes.
